CHAPTER XII

PARKING

SECTION 12.00. Official Parking Restrictions. No owner or operator of any vehicle shall park or stop or leave standing such vehicle, or suffer, or allow, or permit such vehicle to be parked or left standing otherwise than in obedience to traffic regulations, signs, or signals, whether such vehicle is occupied or not, in any of the following places:

- a. Along either side of Town roads within the exterior boundary of the Bong State Recreation Area, or Town roads adjacent to said boundary, or Town roads within 1,320 feet (1/4 mile) from the closest point of said boundary.
- b. Upon any portion of a highway where at the time when stopping is prohibited by official traffic signs indicating the prohibition of any stopping or standing.
- c. Any other areas of parking prohibition and parking restriction shown on an official listing or map on file in the office of the Town Clerk, which listing or map is adopted as part of this section. Failure to observe the restrictions shown on such listing or map shall be a violation of this chapter. The Town Board may, from time to time, make additions or deletions from such listing or map.

SECTION 12.10. <u>Time Limitations</u>. No owner or operator of any vehicle shall park, or stop, or leave standing such vehicle, or suffer, or allow, or permit such vehicle to be parked, or left standing longer than 24 hours in any one place within the right-of-way of any public highway in the Town.

SECTION 12.20. <u>Vehicles not Covered</u>. This chapter shall not apply to official, emergency, or law enforcement vehicles.

ORDINANCE NO. 1-2003

An Ordinance providing for the amendment of "Chapter XII-Parking" of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin.

The Town Board of the Town of Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 12.00 of Chapter XII of the Town of Brighton Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 12.00. Official Parking Restrictions. No owner or operator of any vehicle shall park or stop or leave standing such vehicle, or suffer or allow, or permit such vehicle to be parked or left standing otherwise than in obedience to traffic regulations, signs, or signals, whether such vehicle is occupied or not, in any of the following places:

- Upon any portion of a highway where at the time when stopping is prohibited by a. official traffic signs indicating the prohibition of any stopping or standing.
- Any other areas of parking prohibition and parking restrictions shown on an b. official listing or map on file in the office of the Town Clerk, which listing or map is adopted as part of this section. Failure to observe the restrictions shown on such listing or map shall be a violation of this chapter. The Town Board may, from time to time, make additions or deletions from such listing or map.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance and the amendment provided for hereunder shall become effective after passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION 12.30. Violation of Parking Limit.

12.31. Forfeiture. Any person who shall have received a notice from a Town officer or constable that he has violated any of the provisions of this section may, within five (5) days of the time when such notice was given to such person or attached to his vehicle, pay to the Town Treasurer through the Town Clerk's office, a forfeiture of \$10.00 for the parking violation, as a penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation. Each additional day of violation after the first day during which such violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense and violation.

12.32. <u>Penalty</u>. Any person who fails to make such payment or payments within the five (5) day interval shall be mailed a "Final Notice of Payment Due," which raises the penalty for late payment to a forfeiture of \$25.00.

SECTION 12.40. Removal of Illegally Parked Vehicles. In the event a vehicle remains illegally parked for more than twenty-four (24) hours without being moved, or in an emergency, or to facilitate snow removal, the Town Board or its agent may cause to be removed any vehicle parked in violation of the restrictions shown on the official traffic listing or map. The cost of such removal and storage shall be charged to the owner of the vehicle and shall be in addition to any forfeiture imposed as a penalty.

SECTION 12.50. <u>Sign control</u>. The Town Board shall cause to be erected or installed all regulatory signs and street markings it may deem necessary to give notice of the parking prohibitions and restrictions provided for by this chapter.
